



From the Vicarage.....Old Traditions and New Possibilities

"And it's from the old I travel to the new, Keep me travelling along with you"

Remembrance day was very moving, as it always is. We said the old familiar words, we remembered, and we stood in silent respect. It is good and important to do the same thing year after year sometimes. Our minds and hearts click into a certain gear. When we come to that service, knowing what to expect, we connect with Remembrance Days that we attended in years gone by, and we reflect on the fact that people were saying these same words in the same places before we were old enough to engage with them. We become part of something which is bigger than ourselves.

It's the same when it comes to Christmas. We all have our treasured traditions, the things that give us meaning and a sense of continuity with the past. For our family it is watching "The Muppet Christmas Carol" on Christmas Eve together, in between the Crib Service and Midnight Mass. For us, Christmas starts here. I wonder what your Christmas traditions are and how long you have kept them? Local Clubs & Societies

Aldboro', B'bridge & Dunsforth WI

For our November meeting, we had the privilege of hearing about Singapore from Eve, one of our own members. She gave us a very personal and informative talk and we learnt a lot about a place which has a complex history. Singapore is also known as The Lion City as the name originates from Singa meaning Lion and Pura meaning city. The famous mascot features the head of a lion and the body of a fish, showing the importance of fishing to the island. It was established as an important British colony due to its strategic position between the Indian and Pacific oceans, on important routes. Alongside the British, trade immigrants came to Singapore to work in the developing industries, largely from China, Indonesia and Malaysia. This resulted in a population of very mixed heritage who developed their own style of culture, attire, architecture and cuisine.

We then heard about the fall of Singapore to the Japanese and the brutal massacre that resulted. A military style government was put in place and life became very harsh for the remaining resident population, with food rationing imposed and the constant fear of bombings. Eve described how remembers, as a girl, having to take shelter banana plantations with grandparents and mother when the sirens sounded. The Japanese finally surrendered in 1945 and over the next few decades the British and Malaysians governed the island, until in 1965 the island became The Republic of Singapore. The government worked hard to develop the economy and encouraged international companies to invest there,

resulting in the prosperous city state we see today. The talk ended by looking at various tourist highlights that shouldn't be missed on a trip there, leaving many of us adding Singapore to our Bucket List!

Remembrance Sunday

In these troubled times, with horrific wars taking place in both Gaza and Ukraine, Remembrance Sunday services, and Remembrance Day itself, have never seemed so topical, so urgent and so necessary. There's no doubt that these global conflicts gave our service at Minskip an added poignancy.

Our service has always been special, as we pay tribute to the three Minskip soldiers, Eddie Mawtus, Joseph Crookes and Walter Blades, who perished in the First World War. We celebrated the courage of these three, together with every other serviceman who died in defence of their country, both inside our little church and in the pretty churchyard in front of our church, where a cherry tree has been planted in their memory.

In the days leading up to Remembrance Sunday itself, members of the excellent Minskip Church Council team decorated both the church and the churchyard, creating the most beautiful and tranquil sanctuary.

It is now 104 years after the death of Eddie Mawtus, who was just 18. The debt we owe to

Eddie and all of these brave Minskip men, who served in both World Wars, is immeasurable. We must never forget them. These are challenging times – both in this country and across the world. I cannot remember a time when our country and our world were so conflicted and so fearful for the future. During the service, when we remembered all those who have perished in war, we also prayed for peace and healing.

The service was attended by a number of Eddie Mawtus' relatives, including Jill Boyes, whose grandmother was Eddie's cousin. She commented: "It is wonderful that the young men of Minskip who died in the First World War, as well as those who survived but never recovered, were remembered once more. I would like to thank the village of Minskip for making us feel so welcome again".

Looking ahead, we will be holding our Christmas Carol Service at 6.30pm on Friday December 15. Everyone is welcome, and there will be mince pies and mulled wine for all.

Aldborough News

Autumn has been a long time coming but finally the trees are full of colour and the pavements on the Green Hammerton Road between Boroughbridge and Aldborough are ankle deep in leaves - great to kick your way through when they're dry but not so much fun when it rains, and the leaves turn wet and slippery. St Andrew's, of course, has been decorated with poppies for remembrance over the last few weeks. We are indebted to Carol Ramsay and all the ladies who knitted the poppies for the marvellous displays on the tower and along the arch and railings and elsewhere in the church. This year, Carol also conjured up a couple of much admired new wreaths for the memorial rails at the North Chapel. However, we are equally indebted to a whole group of people: Ali and Daz Ekin who carefully store all the rolls and bags of poppies in their roof space and then deliver them to church; Bob and Beth Walker who carefully lay out and check over the displays; Bob, Barry Osborne and John Whyte who manage to hang the tower waterfall without damaging either the tower, the enormous roll of poppies, or themselves; and Phyll and Mike Steel who organise the hangings on the arch and inside the church; so that just leaves Beth and myself to do the laurel and poppy floral arrangements There are some very in the North Aisle. complimentary comments in the visitors' book. and I see that a group of visitors from Nidd Hall made a special trip to see the St Andrew's poppies.

As most of you will know, a fresh wreath and a set of seven crosses has, for many years, been laid at the Lancaster bomber memorial on the village green on Armistice Day by Aidan Foster. Although Aidan is currently staying at Boroughbridge Manor, son Jonathan and daughter-in law Melanie ensured that Aidan was able to come up to the green on Saturday 11th to oversee the laying of the wreath. It was a beautiful sunny day, and they were joined on the green by a good group of villagers. Mayor Sean Hynes spoke words of remembrance and we all watched as Jonathan laid the wreath and crosses for Aidan, followed by a two minute silence. Everyone took the opportunity to say hello to Aidan, who thoroughly enjoyed the occasion, especially when his old friend Eric Gudgeon, currently the oldest inhabitant of our village, turned up on his shiny motorised scooter!



Then, on the evening of Armistice Day, St Andrew's hosted an organ recital by Dr Phil Wilby with a very appropriate programme of British music from the 17th to 21st century that included several patriotic pieces and a number of songs sung by tenor Richard Rooze with Dr Wilby accompanying him on piano. At the end of the concert, the audience joined in a rousing rendition of Parry's Jerusalem with a finale of The Dambusters March - very appropriate for

us in Aldborough when you know that the planes used in the Dambusters raid were modified Lancasters. I read in one of my history magazines that traditional pipe organs are increasingly being replaced by cheaper keyboards and digital organs to the extent that about four classical pipe organs are going to landfill a week although some are finding new homes in Europe, especially France, the Netherlands and even the reviving churches of the erstwhile Soviet bloc! So, it was a particular delight to listen to Phil's expert playing of our very own organ in such a varied and enjoyable programme. Even better, the concert raised over £750 for Macmillan Cancer Support thanks to some very generous donations. Thanks also to Jane Barber for organising the event.

A couple of months ago, I mentioned that St Andrew's had a new church architect. Jamie Holden. In the middle of October, the church council had a very productive meeting with Jamie where we had initial discussions on ideas for updating the church to allow increased use as a community and heritage space while maintaining its central role as a place of Christian worship. One of the features necessary for planning any modifications is a detailed external and internal scan of the church which will allow effective modelling and any possible changes. illustration of Fortunately, Nuno Fernandez of Prospect House has expertise in this area and very kindly volunteered to carry out the initial scans for us. Some of you will have seen Nuno working on the outside of the church and more recently he and some of his work colleagues have been making detailed scans inside St This has included scanning the Andrew's. very poorly investigated 'crypt space', that runs beneath the stone floor from just inside

the South door to beneath the pews to the north of the font as well as the clock pendulum and weight pits in the tower. Whether this represents remnants of earlier building on the site remains a mystery, but it is certainly an intriguing and exciting thought. We are indebted to Nuno and his colleagues for their very kind assistance.

Soon, of course we will be into advent and will be cleaning and tidying the church ready for Christmas. As always, we look forward to the traditional candlelit Carol Service on Christmas Eve which this year is on Sunday but there will be no service in St Andrew's on Christmas Day. As ever, the bell ringers hope to ring the old year out and the new year in around midnight on the 31st. St Andrew's will also be celebrating the start of the farming year with a Plough Sunday Service in January which this year will be a whole parish service.
